Regulatory Signs

These signs provide notice to road users of traffic laws, and they must be obeyed.



1. 8-Sided Sign, White Letters on Red

The stop sign is the only 8-sided sign you will see on the highway. When you come to a stop sign, you must make a complete stop at the stop line. If there is no stop line, stop before entering a crosswalk. If there is no stop line or crosswalk, stop before entering the intersection. Before starting, you must yield the right-of-way to other vehicles and pedestrians. You may not proceed until it is safe to do so and until the way is clear to completely pass through the intersection.



2. 3-Sided Sign, Red Letters on White

You will see no other signs of this shape on the highway. Slow down as you approach a yield sign. Look to the left and the right. Yield to pedestrians and vehicles. Once you have yielded to vehicles or pedestrians, you may proceed only when you can do so safely.



3. Rectangular (4-Sided) Signs, Black on White

These signs are used to regulate traffic. This particular sign tells you the maximum speed limit for the stretch of highway where it is posted.
