Overview

To ensure compliance with federal ADA regulations, the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) will launch its redesigned website, **MVA.Maryland.gov**, on April 17, 2026.

The new website has been intentionally streamlined to offer a more concise, user-friendly experience. While some content has been reorganized or relocated, all mission-critical information remains accessible.

This guide is designed to help staff quickly understand where commonly viewed content can now be found within the updated site.

The most effective way to become familiar with the new website is to explore it directly—click through pages, navigate key sections, and experience the updated layout firsthand.

This overview is accurate as of April 17, 2026. After the initial launch of the website, items and locations may change.

Definitions

Below is a list of common phrases used when discussing the website.

Utility Navigations: These are the three buttons found at the top of the website. They help users quickly access common tools or services. On the new website, those options are Contact MVA, Product Tracking, and myMVA. Utility navigation is accessible from every page of the website.

Main Navigation: This is the primary menu of the website, located near the top of the page. It contains the main categories and helps users find the most important information.

Footer Navigation: This is the set of links found at the bottom of the website. Footer navigation is accessible from every page of the website.

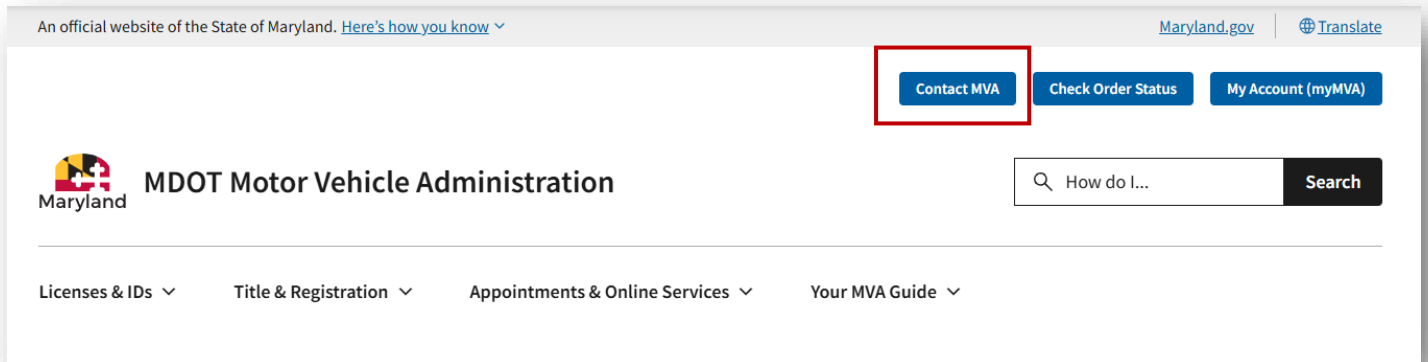

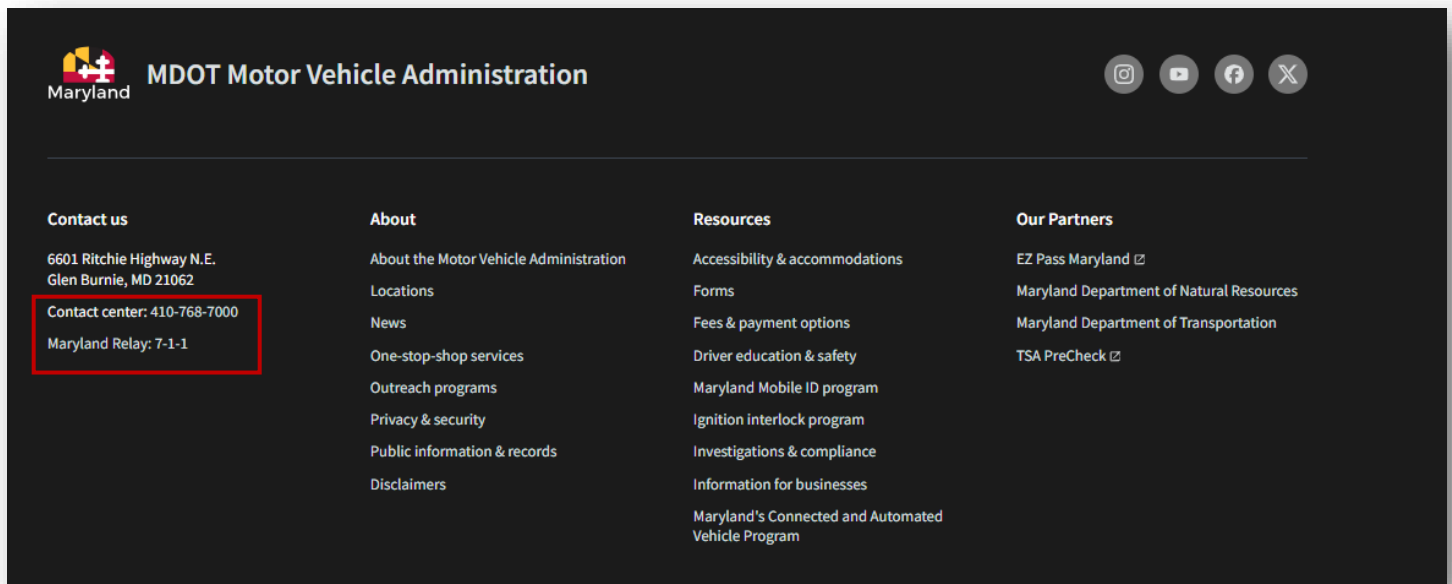
Contact Information

Contact MVA can be found in the utility navigation.



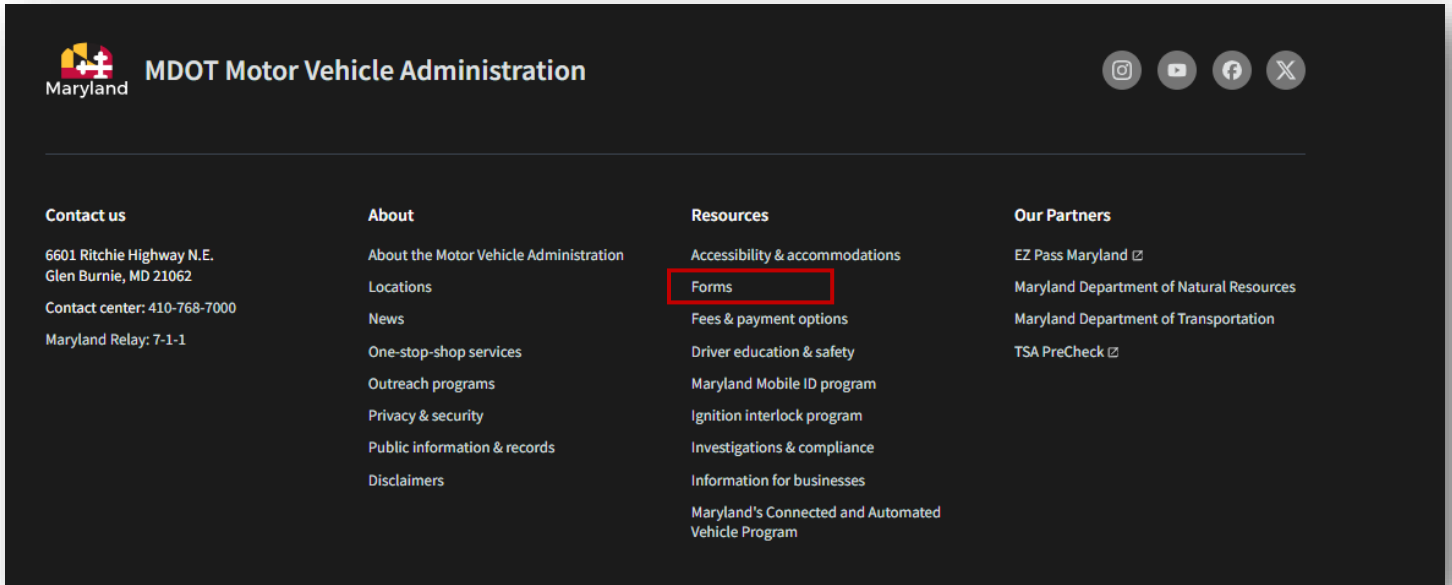
The contact center's phone number can be found in the footer navigation.

Forms are linked directly from pages throughout.

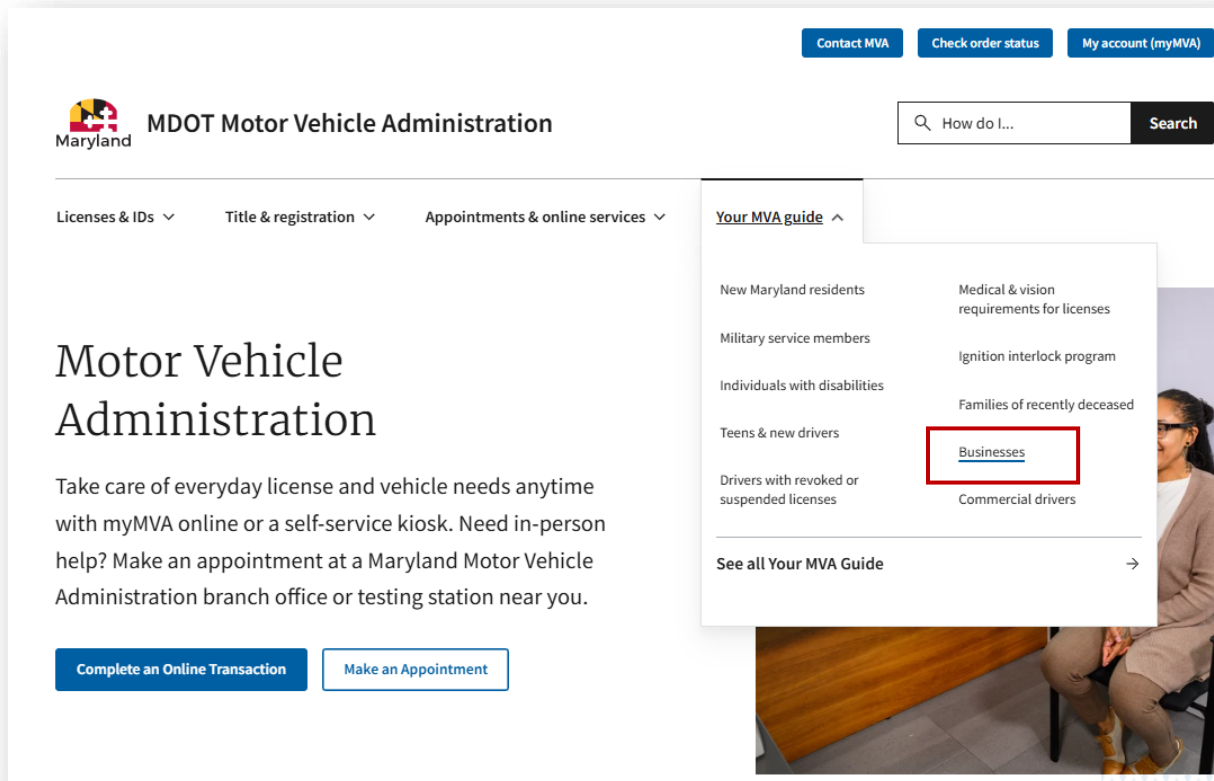
Additionally, the forms database can be accessed from the footer navigation.



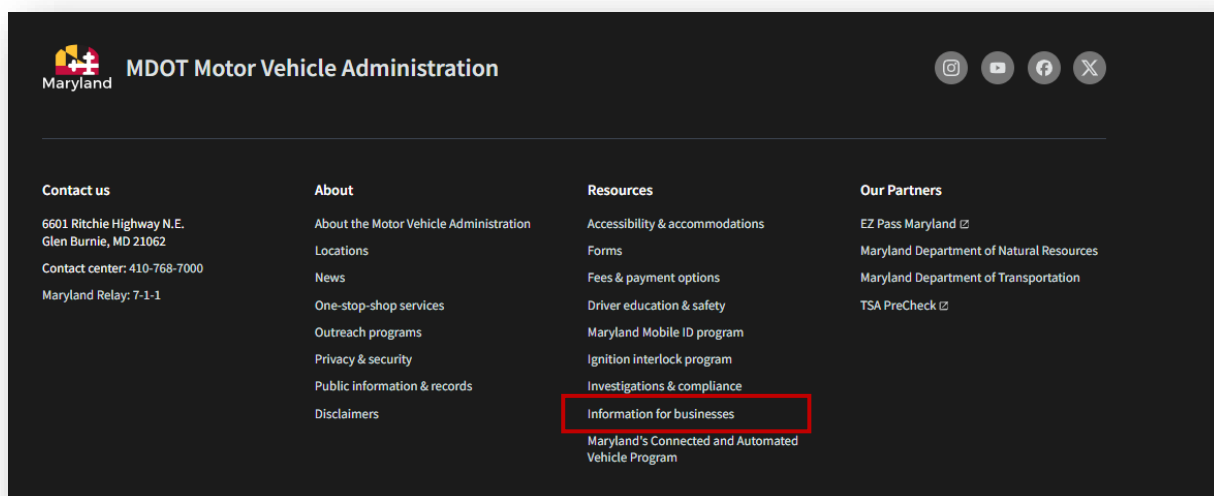
Business Hub

Through the main navigation, under 'Your MVA Guide'.



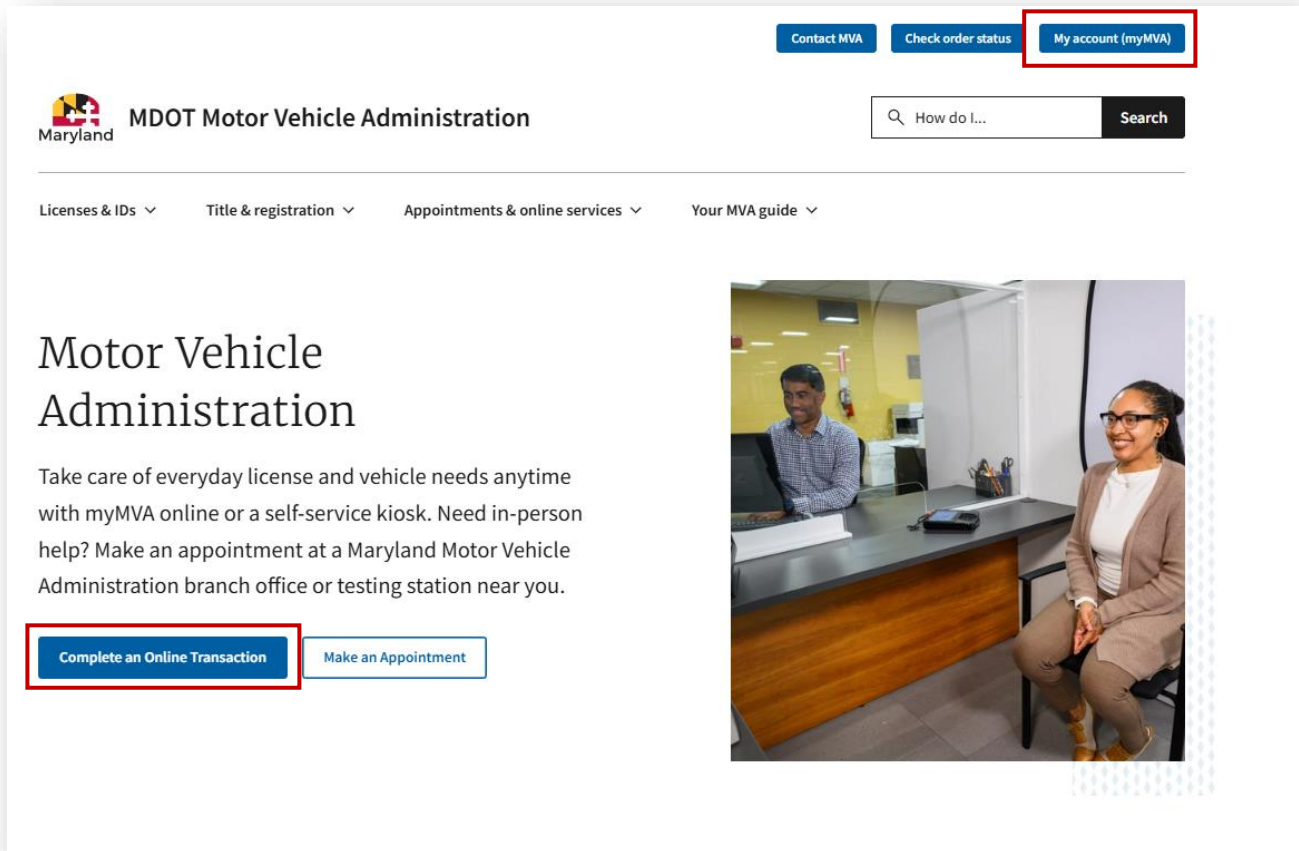
Or, in the footer navigation.



Access to myMVA

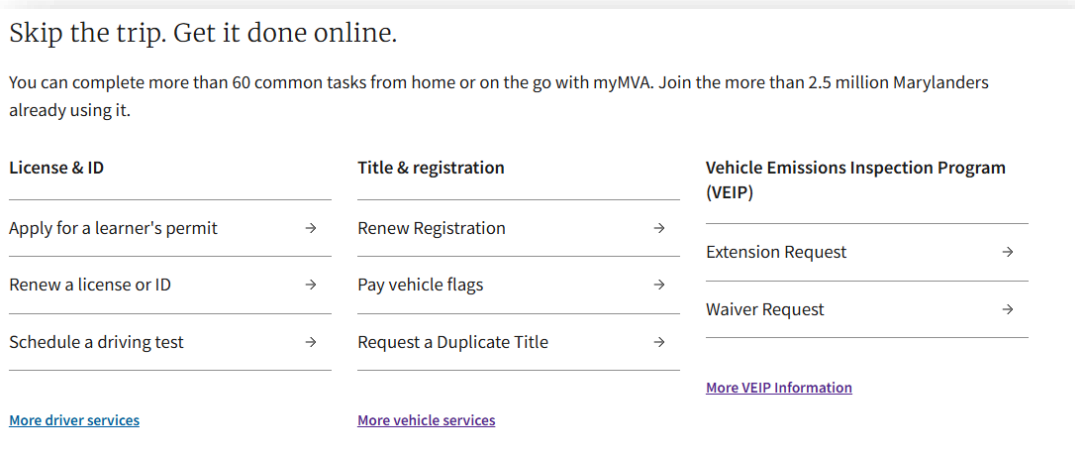
myMVA can be found in multiple places. In addition to the two outlined locations, myMVA is linked throughout the pages.

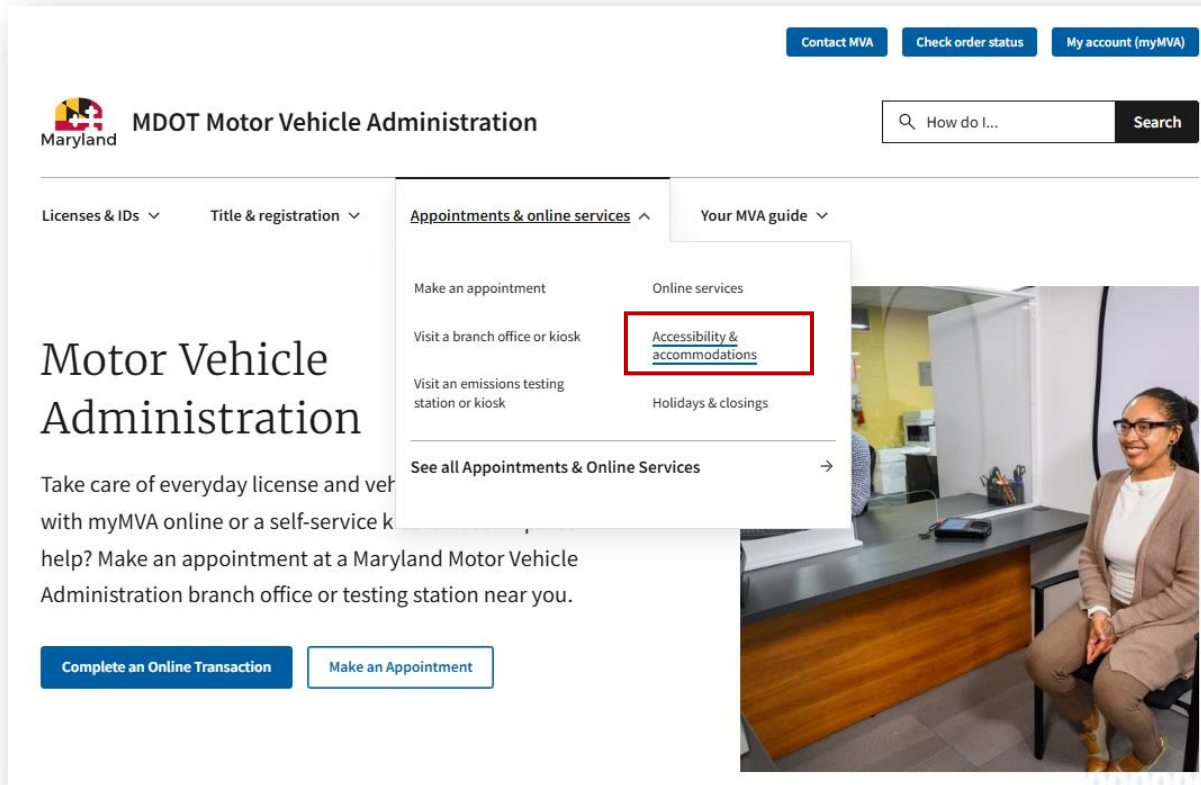

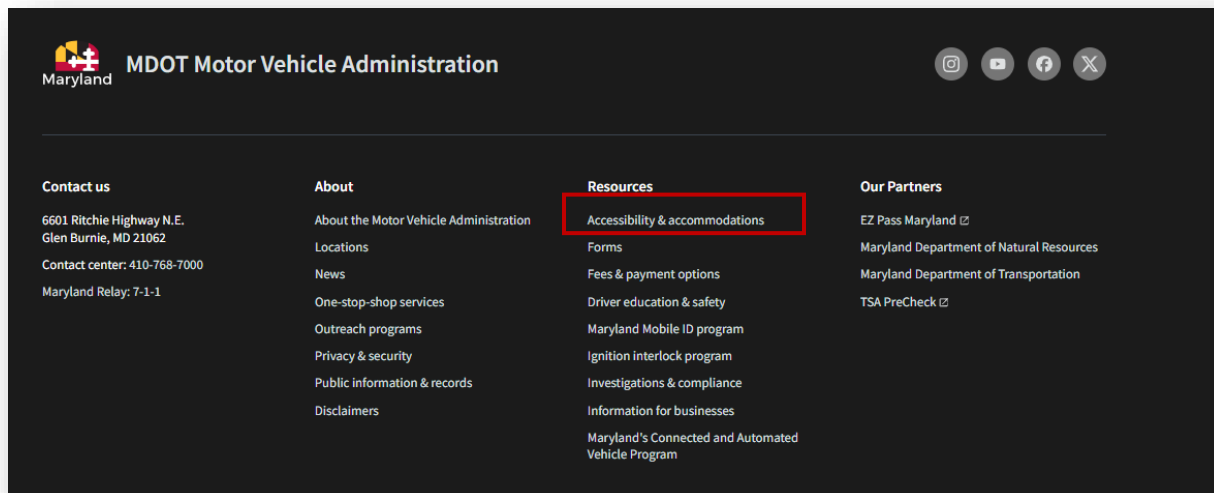
Accommodations

It can also be accessed through the Footer navigation under 'Resources.'

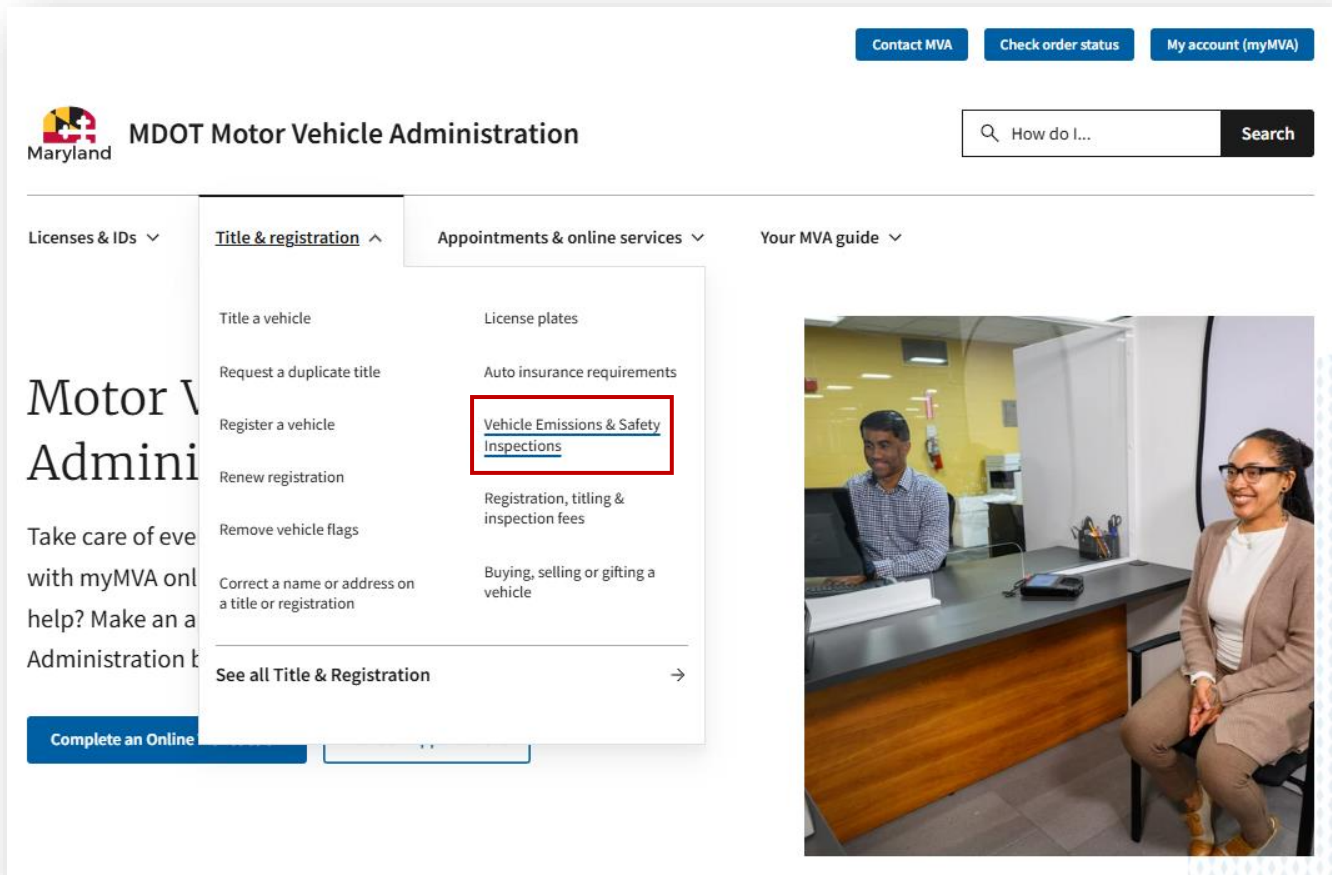


VEIP Information
