**RE:** Temp Tag Reminder

Effective October 1, 2010 dealerships will be required to transmit vehicle and registration information electronically to the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) on the same day they issue a 60-day temporary registration.

The MVA hosted twenty-three (23) seminars around the state to advise dealers of the implementation of the Print on Demand 60-day Temporary Registration. If you have not attended, you may review the information provided at the seminars on the MVA Website at [www.mva.maryland.gov/Resources/Temporary-Plate-Presentation.pdf](http://www.mva.maryland.gov/Resources/Temporary-Plate-Presentation.pdf).

Since this new system requires the temporary registration to be processed electronically, there are several systems available for use by dealers. Both Electronic Titling and Registration Program (ERT) vendors host a web transaction available to all dealers. They are Computerized Vehicle Registration (CVR) – Nyube Bilikha (443) 804-9150 or triVin Inc. – Robert Adams – (860) 235-3279.

In addition to ERT Vendors, both Dealer Associations will have a method of providing the Temporary Registration transaction to dealers. The plastic sleeves needed for the Temporary Registrations are available from the Maryland Correctional Enterprises (MCE). The contact numbers for ordering the sleeves are (410) 799-1240 Monday through Friday 8:00 A.M until 1:00 P.M. The preferred method of ordering is by FAX to (410) 799-1370 which is available anytime.

The current 60-day Temporary Registration Plate will not be available for purchase after September 30<sup>th</sup>. If dealers want to continue to issue Temporary Registration they must utilize the new system. Refunds for unused 60-Temporary Registration Plates (cardboard) will be available from October 1<sup>st</sup> through December 1, 2010 by submitting the unused cardboard Temporary Registration Plates to Business Licensing and Consumer Services. See the MVA website for instructions. Only Temporary Plates purchased within the last year can be returned for a refund.
